





Agency IMPACT



ARTWORKS CINCINNATI:

In 2024, ArtWorks Cincinnati made significant strides in enriching the city's artistic landscape by hosting multiple mural dedications. With the support of the Cincinnati ToolBank, ArtWorks utilized a wide array of tools and equipment including tables, chairs, and AV equipment, amounting to \$8,500 in tool usage. This partnership allowed them to save over \$7,000, ensuring more resources were directed toward fostering creativity and community engagement.







COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY:

April 2024 saw Habitat for Humanity's impactful Rock the Block event in Covington, where over 250 volunteers came together to focus on a range of home repair and beautification projects, including painting, landscaping, and minor repairs for qualifying homeowners. With access to \$56,000 worth of ToolBank tools, this initiative played a vital role in Habitat's mission to create and preserve affordable homeownership. The event stands as a testament to the power of community and collaboration.

ENVIRONMENT

CINCINNATI PARKS FOUNDATION:

The Cincinnati Parks Foundation led the annual Let's Grow Local initiative, aiming to enhance the city's tree canopy. In 2024, this project culminated in the planting of over 200 trees in Avondale's Cleveland Park, making it the largest single-day tree planting event in Cincinnati's history. More than 200 volunteers were equipped with \$24,000 worth of ToolBank tools to make this milestone achievement possible, contributing to a greener, more sustainable future for the city.







FOOD INSECURITY

CROSSROADS CHURCH:

Crossroads Church's annual Thanksgiving Food Drive, held in November 2024, utilized over \$10,000 worth of ToolBank tools and equipment. This event was instrumental in assisting thousands of under-resourced individuals facing food insecurity in the region. Through their collective efforts, an estimated 100,000 people were provided with meals during the holiday season, exemplifying the spirit of giving and community support.



THE HOME DEPOT FOUNDATION:

The Home Depot Foundation, in partnership with the Cincinnati ToolBank, supported the establishment of the new Joseph House Treatment and Recovery for Veterans in Camp Washington. Utilizing \$8,500 worth of ToolBank tools, Team Depot volunteers prepared 4,000 square feet of soil beds, planted 86 containers of trees, shrubs, and grasses, and contributed to a nurturing environment for veterans in recovery.







CINCINNATI REDS COMMUNITY FUND:

The Reds Community Fund spearheaded transformative projects in Bond Hill in 2024, bringing together key organizations to complete a variety of youth-centered initiatives. Leveraging \$55,000 worth of ToolBank tools, this year's Reds Community Makeover featured the creation of a new urban learning garden at Xavier Jesuit Academy (XJA), upgrades to a multi-purpose playground, mural installations, a comprehensive renovation of XJA's baseball field, and enhancements to the Bond Hill Food Pantry.

This year, an incredible group of volunteers dedicated their time and energy to supporting the ToolBank's mission.



In 2024, the ToolBank Training Center hosted hands-on programs with four community partners, equipping over 160 individuals—most from low-income backgrounds—with practical skills in construction, manufacturing, and home repair.

- Cincinnati Construction Academy: 5 cohorts, 50 participants (40+ low-income), trained 5 days/week in construction trades.
- **Urban League (Building Futures):** 2 cohorts, 36 participants (28 low-income), in construction readiness training.
- Cincinnati Youth Collaborative: 2 cohorts, 8
 participants (all low-income), in manufacturing boot
 camps.
- Do it Yourself Darlin: 7 workshops, 67 participants (38 using pay-what-you-can), focused on DIY skills and home maintenance.

These partnerships advance workforce development and self-sufficiency across Greater Cincinnati.





Summer Youth - Manufacturing Exploration:

In summer 2024, the ToolBank launched its first Summer Youth Series, a five-week career exploration camp for rising 6th–9th graders.

Created in response to community feedback, the camp filled

Created in response to community feedback, the camp filled a gap in accessible, affordable career programming for middle school students.

Led by the ToolBank and Impact Agape, 20 students explored careers in trades, manufacturing, IT, and the arts through hands-on projects, STEM activities, and field trips. With support from partners like Allied Construction Industries (ACI), SENCO, TechSolve, and COSI, students worked with professionals and created take-home projects like race cars, cranes, and nail art.

Strong volunteer and partner engagement made the 2024 pilot a success and set the stage for future growth.


