Our focus this year was not just growth but strategic, intentional expansion. We strengthened the systems and spaces that allow our impact to scale, ensuring organizations have reliable access to the tools, training, and support they need to serve their communities effectively.

The Tool Training Center has become a hub for hands-on learning and workforce development, bringing together partners, industry professionals, and community members to build practical skills and pathways into the trades. At the same time, we expanded delivery services and advanced neighborhood-based Mini-ToolBanks, meeting organizations where they are and reducing barriers to access.

This work is made possible by our strong partnerships and a shared commitment to building more resilient, connected communities.

While this report reflects the impact of 2025, we are already building on that momentum. In early 2026, we launched the ToolBank Academy, a youth leadership and workforce development initiative designed to connect young people to skills, opportunities, and community impact. It represents an exciting next chapter for the ToolBank, and we look forward to sharing more as this work grows.

CLIFTON CULTURAL ARTS CENTER:

In 2025, after a five-year hiatus, Clifton Cultural Arts Center saw the return of CliftonFest. This free block party filled the streets with live performances, art vendors, and stunning sidewalk chalk. With support from Cincinnati ToolBank, CCAC utilized a wide range of event equipment — including chairs, tables, and pop-up tents — totaling in over \$8,000 in tool usage. By utilizing ToolBank services, this partnership allowed them to save over \$7,500, ensuring more resources for their community centered efforts.



COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION

PEOPLE WORKING COOPERATIVELY:

November 2025 saw People Working Cooperatively host its far-reaching Prepare Affair event, bringing together more than 1,500 volunteers to help low-income, elderly, and disabled homeowners prepare their homes for winter. As one of the largest volunteer events in the tri-state, teams completed a variety of tasks utilizing over \$10,000 worth of ToolBank tools, which saved them over \$9,500, helping make this large-scale day of service possible.



ENVIRONMENT

KEEP CINCINNATI BEAUTIFUL:

In October 2025, Keep Cincinnati Beautiful partnered with Ohio River Valley Water Sanitation Commission (ORSANCO) for the annual Ohio River Sweep, equipping volunteers to remove litter and debris from the Cincinnati riverfront. Working together, volunteers helped protect local waterways while improving the health and beauty of the Ohio River corridor. With access to more than \$12,000 worth of ToolBank tools, community volunteers were equipped to efficiently collect and remove waste from our waterways.



FOOD INSECURITY

CIVIC GARDEN CENTER:

Throughout 2025, the Civic Garden Center of greater Cincinnati continued empowering communities across Cincinnati to grow fresh food through their urban gardening programs, educational workshops, and events such as GrowFest and their Native Plant Festival. Over the course of the year, the Civic Garden Center utilized more than \$25,500 worth of ToolBank tools to further its mission of supporting community-based food access across the region.



ARLINGTON MEMORIAL GARDENS:

In May 2025, Arlington Memorial Gardens utilized more than \$13,000 worth of ToolBank tools to support their Field of Memories and Lunch with a Veteran events, honoring those who served our country. Utilizing ToolBank chairs, tables, ice chests and our trailer, these resources helped ensure volunteers and guests had what they needed for a successful weekend of remembrance.



CATHOLIC INNER-CITY SCHOOLS EDU:

In April 2025, Catholic Inner-city Schools Education Fund partnered with the Cincinnati ToolBank to give students hands-on experience using tools to build park benches. Working alongside their teachers at the ToolBank facility, students collaborated to construct seven new benches, which were later installed at their school to expand outdoor seating and learning spaces.

In 2025, more than **80 volunteers** from Greater Cincinnati's leading construction and contracting firms came together at Camp Friedlander for the **10th annual Building on Our Community** volunteer event. - Makes a lasting difference for thousands of families across Cincinnati.



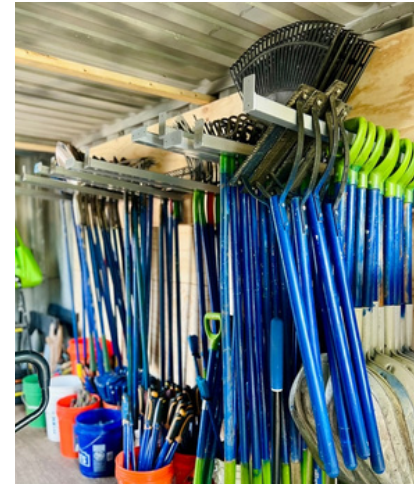


WHAT IS A MINI-TOOLBANK?

The Cincinnati ToolBank's Mini-ToolBank Program is an innovative initiative designed to bring tools closer to the neighborhoods that need them most. These container-based lending hubs are placed in strategic community locations to provide easier, more equitable access to high-quality tools for nonprofits, schools, neighborhood groups, and faith-based organizations conducting beautification, clean-up, and revitalization projects.

GOALS OF THE MINI-TOOLBANK!

- Increase Access: Provide high-need communities with easier access to tools and equipment.
- Boost Volunteer Engagement: Enable more frequent and spontaneous community-led projects.
- Build Local Capacity: Encourage long-term stewardship by empowering residents to take the lead.
- Enhance Sustainability: Reduce the environmental footprint by minimizing transportation needs.

Throughout 2025, our facility continued to host many nonprofit organizations helping them save money, and offer a larger space for their events. Our **Conference Room** has hosted community councils, strategic plannings, workshops, and discussion, while our **Community Space** has hosted award ceremonies, festival plannings, celebrations, and graduations.

In 2025, the ToolBank Training Center hosted hands-on programs with multiple community partners, equipping over **418 individuals** with practical skills in constructions, manufacturing, and home repair.

- **Do It Yourself Darlin:** 15 workshops, focusing on DIY skills and home maintenance.
- **Urban League (Building Futures):** 2 cohorts, 45 students, in construction readiness training.
- **Cincinnati Construction Academy:** 3 cohorts, 24 participants, trained 5 days/week in construction trades.
- **CleanCut Bath:** 4 classes, 28 participants learning how to install ADA accessible bathtubs.
- **Merus:** Hosted their annual superintendants meeting with over 45 project leaders in attendance.

These partnerships advance workforce development and self-sufficiency across Greater Cincinnati.





SUMMER YOUTH SERIES CAREER EXPLORATION



In 2025, the Cincinnati ToolBank, in partnership with Winton Hills Community Council hosted its second Summer Series. This four-week career exploration camp geared towards middle school aged youth intended to fill the gap in accessible, affordable career programming in our community.

Students explored careers in trades, manufacturing, IT, and the arts through hands-on projects, STEM activities, and field trips. With support from our partners like **Valley and Cincinnati Zoo** students worked with professionals and created take-home projects like backyard birdhouses!

Coming up in 2026, the ToolBank will be bringing back **Rosie's Girls**, an empowering experience that combines skilled trades, leadership development, teamwork, and creativity in a supportive encouraging environment.

MARGAUX ROBERTS | MINI-TOOLBANK PROGRAM COORDINATOR

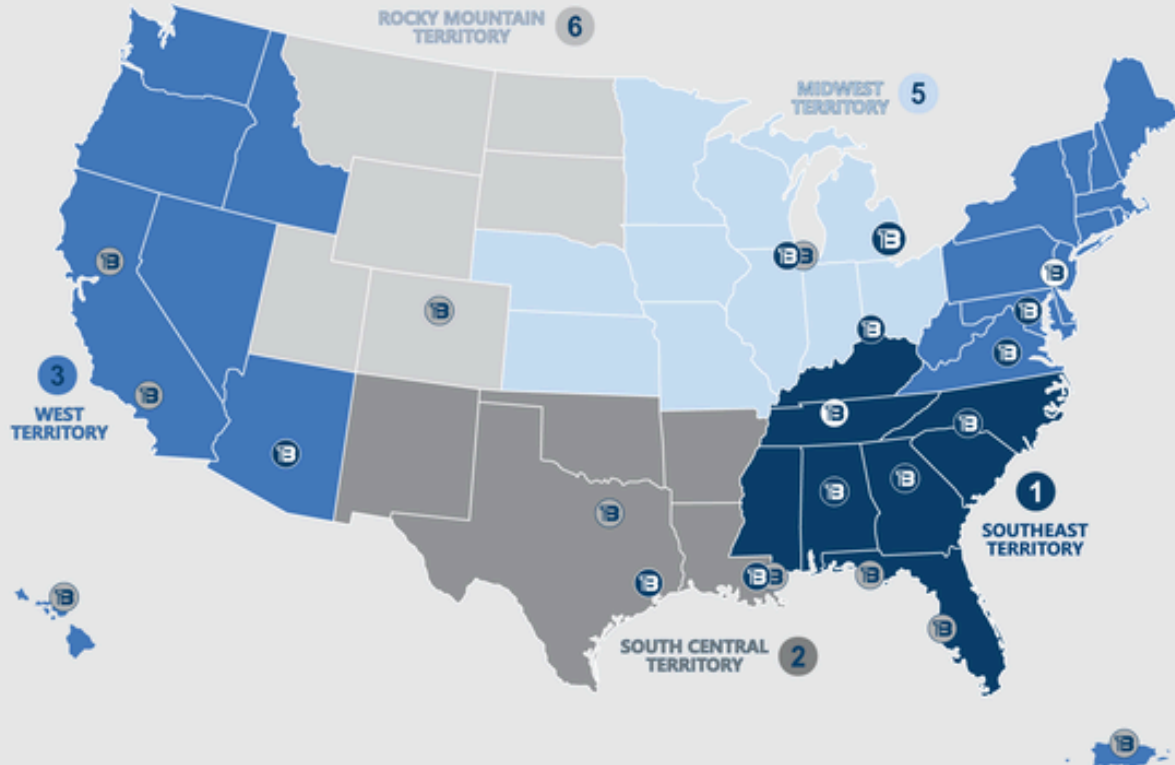
